# Sunday, September 10

Read Psalm 15 three times. Answer the following questions:

- 1. What does this Psalm mean?
- 2. What do I need to change or deal with?
- 3. What is God saying to me?

## Monday, September 11

Read Psalm 100. Do the following:

- Spend at least a half/hour with God, during which you worship, pray, and try to listen to God's voice.
- Suggestion: Listen to Paul Wilbur "Jerusalem Arise" on YouTube, or any other worship music that touches your heart.

## Tuesday, September 12

Read Psalm 24 three times. Answer the following questions:

- 1. What is God saying to me?
- 2. What do I need to change to be able to go into God's presence?
- 3. How can I worship the King of Glory?

#### Wednesday, September 13

Read Mark 11:22-26. Pray for the following:

- Pray for your family, friends, and coworkers.
- Ask God to show you if there is any un-forgiveness in your heart toward anyone.
- Ask God to bring reconciliation and healing.

#### Thursday, September 14

Read Psalm 130 at a normal pace, and then again, prayerfully and slowly, read Psalm 130 out loud. Take some time to think about this psalm.

- Let the words move you and let God touch your heart.
- Take some time to turn this Psalm into a prayer and then pray it with feeling and conviction!
